For the fall 2021 semester, we received over 21,000 applications for an incoming class of 4,100. The middle 50% of applicants offered admission had an unweighted GPA ranging from 3.46 to 3.74.

Completing an Application

A complete application for freshman admission includes the following:

- ◆ A completed online application via Navigator (ECU’s admission portal), CFNC or the Common Application
- ◆ Nonrefundable \$75 application fee
- ◆ ECU accepts fee waivers from the College Board, the ACT and the National Association of College Admissions Counselors.
- ◆ Official high school transcript, including senior year courses in progress and current grade point average on a 4.0 scale. For quicker processing, N.C. students are encouraged to send transcripts via CFNC.

Freshmen applying for the fall 2023 term will not be required to submit standardized (ACT or SAT) test scores to be reviewed for admission. However, standardized test scores may be required to apply for certain merit scholarships. Please note that students applying for terms in 2024 and beyond may be required to submit standardized test scores for admission review.

For students attending a North Carolina public high school, P grades will not be calculated as part of GPA calculation for admission review. However, a P grade will provide course credit to meet the minimum Freshman Core Requirements. Courses with a grade of W will not be accepted to fill the Freshman Core Requirements.



10 Recommendations to High School Counselors

1. Visit the Counselors page at admissions.ecu.edu/connect/counselors for up-to-date high school counselor information. If you're not already signed up for our email list, subscribe here.
2. Have students create a Navigator account at admissions.ecu.edu.
3. Encourage students to use our Application Checklist – via their Navigator account – to track the status of their application.
4. Recommend our Honors College to your high-achieving students. Visit honors.ecu.edu to learn about opportunities, scholarship levels and admissions requirements. Students must complete their ECU application by November 1 (including receipt of transcripts) to be eligible for the additional Honors College application.
5. Learn more about scholarship opportunities by visiting scholarships.ecu.edu. The university scholarships deadline is January 15, 2023. Students should apply to ECU no later than December 15, 2022, to ensure they receive their admission credentials in time to apply for scholarships.
6. Encourage students who are unsure about what they want to study to visit Degree Explorer at www.ecu.edu/degrees and research all the academic programs ECU has to offer. Degrees can be searched for by major, coursework, career type and other factors.
7. A great resource for students who have a major in mind is advising.ecu.edu. This website provides assistance with academic degree planning.
8. Advise students to use an application fee waiver if they are eligible. ECU traditionally accepts the College Board, NACAC and ACT application fee waivers.
